Finnish-American locals were in for a special treat on Saturday, June 3rd, as they had the rare opportunity to enjoy a captivating evening concert by Kardemimmit in the picturesque foothills of West Paris, Maine.

Kardemimmit is a Finnish music group known for their traditional Finnish folk music. The group was formed in 1999 and consists of four members: Maija Pokela, Jutta Rahmel, Anna Wegelius, and Leeni Wegelius. They are all skilled players of the kantele, which is a traditional Finnish string instrument.

Kardemimmit's music is characterized by beautiful vocal harmonies and intricate kantele

arrangements. They draw inspiration from Finnish folklore and traditions, infusing their music with a sense of nostalgia and cultural heritage. Their repertoire includes both original compositions and traditional Finnish folk songs, which they often arrange in their own unique style.

### **100 YEARS OF FINNAIR**

Finnair, the sixth oldest continuously operating airline in the world, turns 100 years old this year.

On 12 September 1923 the charter establishing the company was signed in Helsinki. The first flight was on 20 March 1924, from Helsinki to Tallinn, Estonia, on a Junkers F.13 aircraft equipped with floats. In 2020, Finnair carried 3.5 million passengers aboard 83 aircraft and it has been consistently rated as one of the safest

airlines in the world.

### **SCHOLARSHIPANNOUNCEMENT**

The Oxford Hills Scholarship Foundation has received a generous contribution from the late Veikko Piirainen's will. In accordance with his wishes, a scholarship has been established in his honor. Alpo M. Kahkonen passed away on Tuesday April 4, 2023, at home in South Paris with his loving family by his side. He was born Feb. 22, 1938, in Lewiston, the youngest of six children born to Matti H. and Ida (Hytonen) Kahkonen. After attending Paris schools, he enlisted in the US Army in April 1959. Returning home, he worked for many years as a truck driver, retiring from St. Johnsbury in 1993. He married Carmen Lea MacAllister on 15 April 1961 and together they raised three sons Kevin A., Gregory K., and Duane J. In addition to his loving parents, he was predeceased by three infant siblings (Reino Emil, Oiva Matias, and Aino) and his brother Eino Arvid. He is survived by his wife Carmen, their sons, his brother Edwin M., and his granddaughters Kenzie and Kori Kahkonen.

### FINLAND'S LAKES AND FORESTS

#### Home to Enigmatic Creatures

The mystical allure of Finland's expansive lakes and dense forests has given rise to a rich tapestry of



mythological creatures. From benevolent beings to fearsome monsters, these entities inhabit the realms of Finnish folklore, captivating the imaginations of those who encounter their tales. Let's delve into some of the most remarkable

creatures lurking within the depths of Finland's waters and the shadows of its woodlands.

One such creature is Hiisi, an ancient spirit associated with wooded hills and groves. Initially revered for creating horses, Hiisi later became a monstrous figure in Finnish mythology, attacking travelers and pilfering from homes. Haltija, the Finnish equivalent of elves or gnomes, are diverse in nature. Tonttu, the house elves, are famous as the inspiration behind Santa's helpers, while water haltija emerge from the sea with stone hats and boots, aiding in tasks like tree felling and water purification.

Peikko, resembling a giant, possesses the ability to change size, become invisible, and even tamper with children's teeth. Finnish mythology also includes Iku-Turso, a formidable creature akin to the Kraken, and Menninkäinen, resembling Tolkien's Hobbits, with a fondness for riddles and shiny treasures. Näkki, the deceptive water spirits, lurk in murky depths, luring and drowning unsuspecting children.

Bears, regarded as divine beings, hold immense significance in Finnish folklore. The Otso, or Kings of the Forest, were once worshiped as gods, and their remains were ceremoniously placed in sacred clearings. Tapio, the forest god, and his wife Mielikki, the goddess, are invoked for bountiful game and livestock protection. Lastly, the haunting figure of Vedenemo, the "Mother of Waters," lures humans with her enchanting songs, bringing ill omens to those who encounter her.

These mythical creatures add depth and mystery to Finland's natural landscape, weaving a tapestry of folklore that continues to captivate and intrigue both locals and visitors alike.
